We will be serving tomato-basil soup, a Mediterranean salad, rolls and for dessert, berries with whipped cream.





Proposed Civilian By-law Change

Approved by Civilian Board in October 2017

Will be presented in the spring to the Membership.

Delete the following passage.

Article III—Membership

Section 3. Civilian

(B) ...Widows or wives of Retired Military Officers who were formerly native residents of San Antonio and have returned to the area for residency may be elected as Civilian Associate members by the Executive Board in May, providing there is a vacancy. At no time shall this group exceed ten in number.

Proposed Military By-Law Change

Approved by the Membership on Dec 11, 2017

Red is original wording deleted in top section.
Blue is wording added in changed section.

Original:

Article III---Membership

Section 2. Military

- A) Active membership shall be limited to one hundred fifty members, all of whom shall reside in the San Antonio area. Active members shall vote and hold office. They shall pay dues and attend two meetings per club year or forfeit membership. Active membership may be offered to women of the following categories according to duty assignment:
- 1) Spouses of active duty officers and officers of the rank of O-6 or above to include those selected for promotion to O-6.
 - 2) Government civilians of the Senior Executive Service (SES), or their spouses.
- 3) Members of each major Department of Defense command to include the Reserve, National Guard, and National Security Agency, or their spouses, according to the allocation established by the bylaws.
- B) Associate membership shall be composed of active members who retire or whose male spouses from duty in the San Antonio area. Associate members shall vote and hold office. They shall pay dues and attend four meetings per club year or forfeit membership.

Application for membership shall be made in writing during the month of retirement. Applicants on the waiting list may attend luncheons on a space-available basis.

Women who are retired military officers or spouses of retired military officers, who formerly were stationed in the San Antonio area and were members of the club during a past service tour, have returned to the area for residency, shall be eligible for Associate Membership.

G) Total Active and Associate membership shall not exceed two hundred twenty-six members. When accepting new members, those eligible for Active membership have priority over those eligible for Associate membership. Associate membership shall never exceed 40% of the number of Active and Associate members allowed. Each service shall have no more than 113 Active and Associate members combined, of which no more than 45 may be Associate members.

Change:

Article III---Membership

Section 2. Military

- A) Active membership shall be limited to one hundred fifty members, all of whom shall reside in the San Antonio area. Active members shall vote and hold office. They shall pay dues and attend two meetings per club year or forfeit membership. Active membership may be offered to women of the following categories according to duty assignment:
- 1) Spouses of active duty officers and officers of the rank of O-6 or above to include those selected for promotion to 0-6.
 - 2) Government civilians of the Senior Executive Service (SES), or their spouses.
- 3) Members of each major Department of Defense command to include the Reserve, National Guard, and National Security Agency, or their spouses, according to the allocation established by the bylaws.
- B) Associate membership shall be composed of active members who retire or whose male spouses retire from duty in the San Antonio area. Associate members shall vote and hold office. They shall pay dues and attend four meetings per club year or forfeit membership.

Application for membership shall be made in writing during the month of retirement. Applicants on the waiting list may attend luncheons on a space-available basis.

Women who are retired military officers (0-6 or above) or spouses of retired military officers (0-6 or above), who reside in the San Antonio area shall be eligible for Associate Membership.

G) Total Active and Associate membership shall not exceed two hundred members. When accepting new members, those eligible for Active membership have priority over those eligible for Associate membership. Associate membership shall never exceed 40% of the number of Active and Associate members allowed. Each service shall have no more than 113 Active and Associate members combined, of which no more than 45 may be Associate members.

Year-4 Here's the Score!

MCCF has found her pace. We have established a solid history of both revenue and expense within a few years. We know what it costs to operate and are gaining experience and expertise in funding direct, targeted support of our military scholars, families and Ambassadors. We maintain one full year of *minimal* operating costs and full program awards in reserves in preparation for an uncertain world situation in the event we need to act quickly and directly. Because of our membership composition, we are in a unique position to recognize and know the established, proven military service providers and can readily supply funding in support of proven, successful organizations.

Year-1 2014-2015 Revenue of \$57,472. Program expense (direct military aid) of \$30,931.

Year-1 was a formative year, with revenue and support transferred between the Club and the Foundation. Our revenue began to grow with generous donations from our membership while our program dollars continued at an increasing level in support of our project focus. The Patriot scarf sales were initiated at that time to offset sequestration years and provided an estimated \$18,500 seed money for the Foundation.

Year-2 2015–2016 Revenue of \$77,493. Program expense of \$44,087

Year-3 2016-2017 Revenue of \$87,852. Program expense of \$46,754

Year-4 2017–2018 Budgeted Revenue of \$79,000. Budgeted Program expense \$59,645

Our cash balance, as of 15 Dec was \$98,935 with \$57,353 program dollars to be spent by year-end. That should leave us with a healthy balance to fund our programs next year and expand our outreach.

Be assured your Foundation Board of Directors and highly qualified Committee members are hard at work to deserve your confidence and deliver your desire to aid our military and family members in a direct, effective and efficient manner. Thank you for your continued support. It's amazing what we have accomplished together!

Scholarships

In 1945, Mil-Civ awarded \$500 to Trinity University President Laurie to be used for scholarships in the name of the Military-Civilian Club. Over the next 25-years, Mil-Civ built the corpus by adding amounts as small as \$5 memorials; to money received from "no-show" luncheons; significant contributions of the entire surplus revenue each year, and individual donations. Over the years the endowment had grown to a very substantial sum, granting approximately \$4,000 per year to a deserving military family student attending Trinity University. It operates independently of our Club, reporting our MCC Scholarship financial condition to the Board each December. In the 1990's the Club reorganized a Scholarship Program using new funds directly from Mil-Civ.

Within ten years, we joined forces with the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation of the San Antonio Area Foundation, to administer hundreds of applications received each year. Our very qualified Mil-Civ Foundation Scholarship Committee works through the culled applications and makes the decision to award approximately \$10,000 each year to several military family students.

Military Family Support and the Warrior Family Support Center

For many years, our members delivered diapers and baby wipes to the December luncheon for delivery to the WFSC. Eventually, family needs changed and Mil-Civ member/Director of the WFSC, Judith Markelz, asked we supply Gift Cards for easy distribution and to meet a wide variety of wishes from military families. Since December 2013, well over \$35,000 in gift cards have been received and delivered directly to our Warrior Families to include just over \$10,000 raised this past December.

Military Ambassador Program began 55 years ago, in 1963.

The Fiesta Commission asked Mil-Civ to assume all responsibility for the now-known-as Military Ambassadors, and we haven't stopped since. The MA's were formally introduced to the community with formal afternoon Teas held in member homes. This soon outgrew our homes and gardens, and became an informal evening reception with 1/3 Military, 1/3 Fiesta dignitaries and 1/3 civic leaders. Our members serve as Hostesses. Fiesta 2017 brought a new Partner --- USAA, known throughout the world as supporter and advocate of our Military. USAA was \$20,000 Lead Sponsor of the Ambassadors last year and we have just received notice of a second year of Sponsorship in the amount of \$24,000. Thank You!

MCCF Programs we support are vetted! The Military Family Support Committee, chaired by VP Holly Jones (M), conducts yearlong, ongoing research into partnerships with existing programs proven to directly benefit our military: Active duty, Reserve and Retired. Site visits and interviews are conducted, a written event description with budget submitted, with Committee and Board discussion and vote before allocations are awarded. The Committee goal is to match our ability with an unmet need that our Club & Foundation would support. To date, our partnerships include: WFSC; BAMC Auxiliary; "Quiet Santa" and "Quiet Bunny" programs at Lackland and Ft Sam for autistic and special needs children at JBSA; Cohen Clinic/Family Endeavors providing meds and labs; the VA Hospital; Military Child Education Coalition training to assimilate military-students in new schools; Vogel Resiliency Center, a JBSA joint venture focused on health & wellness for military families to include Retirees; Harvest Community Garden at Ft. Sam Elementary School; National Military Family Association and Operation Healing Adventures Family Retreat. Our level of involvement grows with your areas of interest and the needs of our military community.
