PURPOSE

The purpose of the Military-Civilian Charitable Foundation (MCCF) is to foster patriotism and the integration of the military and civilian communities of the San Antonio, TX area, to provide scholarships for children of active or retired military personnel, to support organizations that assist military personnel and their families, to support the Military Ambassador Program, and to raise the positive profile of Military service in Texas.

To be a primary resource through which donors support the San Antonio area Military Community.

MISSION

To enhance the military's integration into the greater San Antonio Community; provide college scholarships for military children; support organizations that assist military members, veterans, and their families; and to recognize and celebrate Military service through our Military Ambassador Program.

The Military-Civilian Charitable Foundation (MCCF) received its charter on October 28, 2014 and received its non-profit status on November 6, 2014.

The MCCF is an affiliate of the Military-Civilian Club (MCC) of San Antonio. These organizations have supported the military and their families in the San Antonio area since May 21, 1921. In 2014, the MCC elected to form the MCCF with three main program areas:

Scholarship Program Military Ambassador Program Military Family Support Program



- The Military-Civilian Club and the Military-Civilian Charitable Foundation have been awarding scholarships since the mid 1970's.
- Our scholarships are open to children of career military personnel who attend high school in Bexar County.
- The MCCF considers the unique challenges military families face with frequent relocations
- Scholarships are administered by the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation. In 2022, 79 applications were received for the MCCF scholarship.
- Our 2021-2022 goal was to distribute \$20,000 (four \$5,000) in scholarships and increase to eight by 2025. The MCCF was able to award six graduating seniors each a \$5,000 scholarship in 2022

In addition to the support of the MCC members, we thank Enterprise Holdings (\$2,000) and J. McLaughlin (\$408) for their donations to support our Scholarship Program. Past MCC President Mary Wieser donated one \$5,000 scholarship in honor of all past Presidents of MCC.




MILITARY AMBASSADOR PROGRAM
